



- Veligers in Tiber
- K-9 units and divers did not find adult mussels, though dogs detected at both locations
- Fouled waters closed initially but now reopened
- ICS revised state program



Flathead AIS Strategic Prevention Plan Update (post Tiber)

- Management area

 - Address limitations of containment/local boater progr.



MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING BETWEEN BLACKFEET NATION, AND THE FLATHEAD BASIN COMMISSION

This Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) is entered into this _____day of April, 2015 by the Blackfeet Nation and the Flathead Basin Commission.

I. PARTIES

The Blackfeet Nation is responsible for maintaining fish, wildlife, and recreational opportunities on the Blackfeet Reservation and in that capacity is responsible for managing Aquatic Invasive Species (AIS) on tribal lands and in tribal waters.

The FBC is a non-regulatory organization whose mission is to protect the existing Flathead region aquatic environment and the natural resources and environment of the Flathead Basin.

II. PURPOSE

The purpose of this MOU is to formalize the commitment of the Blackfeet Nation and the Flathead Basin Commission (FBC), hereinafter referred to as the Tribe and the FBC, respectively, to provide certain resources to operate an AIS Watercraft Inspection Station (WIS) on the Tribal Reservation in Browning on Highway 2. The purpose of the WIS is to provide boaters with information on the threats of AIS, and to physically inspect all watercraft (i.e., vessel as per 61-1-101, MCA) to minimize the risk of transporting AIS into the Reservation, into the Flathead Basin or between Montana water bodies.

This certificate must be present and valid to launch on any Blackfeet Nation waters. Keep one copy of this certificate with the watercraft at all times and place the other on your dashboard before launching.







Blackfeet AIS Program (2017)

Inspection before launch

- 3 mandatory stations
- 2 certification stations
- 1 decon station
- Expanded hours/season
- Limitations on motorized boats
- eDNA Monitoring
- Ban on ballast boats/waders
- Enhanced enforcement

By 2017

- 100% Tribal inspectors
- Tribal program manager
- 5 mussel fouled boats



Glacier National Park



- A leader within NPS
- Triggering event
- Waters now closed to motorized boats
- eDNA testing
- Heightened educational efforts

City of Whitefish – IBL gating program

- Both launch sites gated
- Decon (\$40) mandatory prior to launch for boats:
 - ballast tanks
 - launched in a mussel fouled water in the last 30 days
 - standing water
 - too dirty to inspect



Conclusion



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- Rule-making will bring consistency and integration to the various Flathead AIS programs, while retaining the highest levels of protection
- Nested within the broader state program
